## Where and When did Halloween Start?

About 2,000 years ago in the area of the world that is now Ireland, the United Kingdom, and northem France, lived a group of people called the Celts. The Celts' lives revolved around growing their food, and considered the end of the year to be the end of the harvest season. (=ovycousin) So, they celebrated New Year's Eve each year on October 31st with a festival called "Samhain," named after their Lord of the Dead (also known as the Lord of Darkness). Samhain (pronounced 'sow-in'= $\sigma \pi 0 p \alpha$ ) Back then, winter was the time of year associated with human death. The Celts believed that on the night that marked the end of summer and the beginning of winter, the boundary(=ópto) between the worlds of the living and the dead blurred (fitov Sug $\delta$ ókp(to) allowing ghosts of the dead to return to earth. Celts thought that the presence of the ghosts made it easier for the Druids, their priests, to predict the future. These predictions were an important source of comfort and direction for the Celts during their long, dark, frightening winters.
 burn crops and animals as sacrifices to their ancient gods. During the celebration, the Celts dressed up in costumes consisting of animal heads and skins and tried to tell each other's fortunes. ( $\mu(\rho \alpha)$
The Celts eventually were conquered ( $=\kappa \alpha \tau \alpha \kappa \pi \sigma^{\theta} \theta \kappa \kappa \alpha$ ) by the Romans, and by about the year 43 AD two Roman festivals were combined with the Celtic Samhain festival. The first Roman festival was Feralia, a day in late October when the Romans traditionally commemorated ( $\left.=\tau \mu \circ \hat{\sigma} \sigma \alpha v \pi \mu v \mu^{\prime} \mu \eta\right)_{\text {) }}$ the passing of the dead. The second was a day to honor Pomona, the Roman goddess of fruit and trees. The symbol of Pomona is the apple and the incorporation(= $\varepsilon \vee \sigma \omega \mu \alpha ́ \tau \omega ण)^{\text {) }}$ ) of this celebration into Samhain probably explains the tradition of "bobbing" for apples practiced today on Halloween.
By 800 AD , the influence of Christianity spread into Celtic lands. In the seventh century, Pope Boniface
 holiday known as the All Saints' Day, a time to honor saints and martyrs. The combined and updated(= oúyxpov7) celebration was also called All-hallows or All-hallowmas (from Middle English Alholowmesse meaning All Saints' Day) and the night before it, the night of Samhain, began to be called All-hallows Eve or Halloween.

## How to make Pumpkins for Halloween

Firstly, before you can carve ( $=\chi \alpha p \alpha ́ \sigma \sigma \omega$ ) your marvelous creation, you must ensure you pick the perfect
 pumpkin.( $=$ ко $\lambda о к \dot{v} \theta \alpha$ ) Not just any old pumpkin will do. You should first start off deciding which design
 shape of pumpkin you are going to buy. There is no use in buying a small pumpkin if you plan to carve out a complex design
When you have bought it, you should make sure it is free of nicks ( $=$ ypou $\zeta 0$ vió) and cuts as this could reduce the lifespan (=xpóvo $\zeta \omega \check{\varsigma}$ ) of your creation. Get a pumpkin with a stalk (= $\mu \mathbf{i \sigma \chi o}$ ) preferably.


Before you finally decide on your perfect pumpkin, you should study it meticulously (= $\sigma$ 人o $\alpha \alpha \sigma \tau \pi \alpha$ ) to determine where the picture or face should go. Usually the side that has the widest surface area is best. If you have an actual drawing or rough sketch of the image you plan to carve, now is the time to hold it against the pumpkin to see if it meets your needs.
